M: Have you ever been invited to social gatherings you didn't want to attend? If you've experienced this situation, you may know how difficult it is to reject the invitation. But sometimes turning it down can be the only realistic solution because of a busy schedule or personal reasons. You can use the following tips to refuse an invitation politely and respectfully. First, understand why you were invited and thank the person who invited you. Then show regret that you're not able to attend, and let the person know that you would accept the invitation under different circumstances. Cards and gifts can also be good ways to smooth the situation over.
