W: Hello, class! Let's continue talking about animals. An animal's body is made up of tiny cells, which are mostly water. If the water freezes, it damages the cells. So how do animals stay warm in the cold? Some animals have a material that keeps them warm. For example, birds have feathers. Most mammals have fur or hair, and sea mammals like whales and seals have a layer of fat under the skin. Reptiles like snakes do not have such material, so they stay underground at night or in cold weather. The temperature below ground does not fall as low as at the surface. Insects also have their own way to keep warm. Insects that live in cold places have special proteins in their bodies, called antifreeze proteins. These proteins stop ice from forming inside their bodies. Now let's watch a video clip about the animals we talked about.
